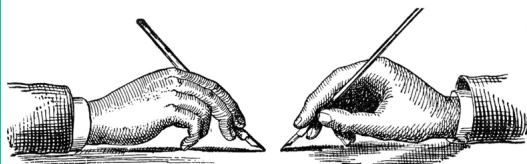

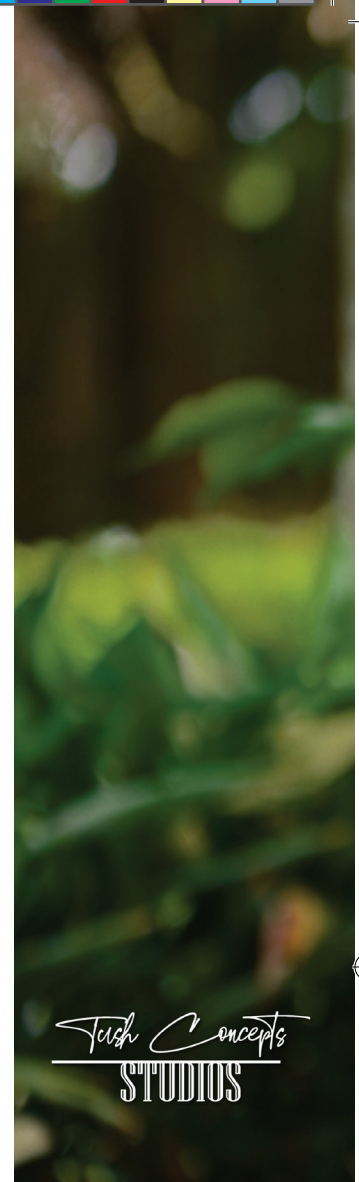
“You Have Certified the Requirements for the Award” Prof. Waswa Balunywa

She is a team player with great communication skills, innovative and a professional at her job. She is skilled in acting, Movie Directing, Make-up and

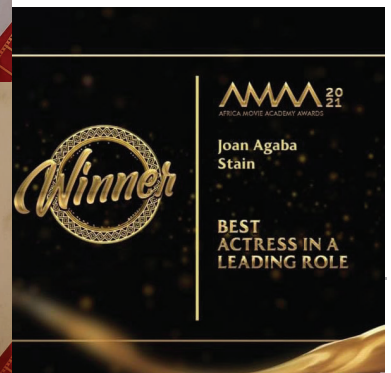

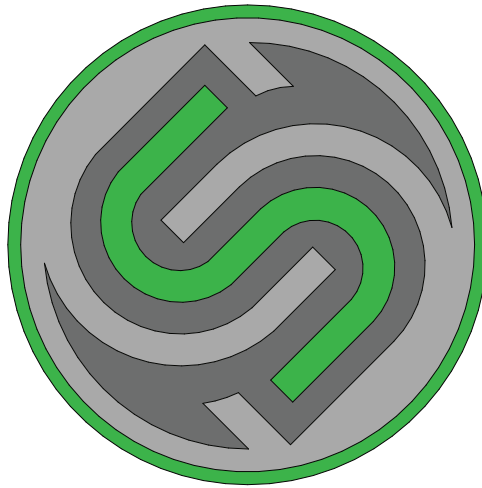

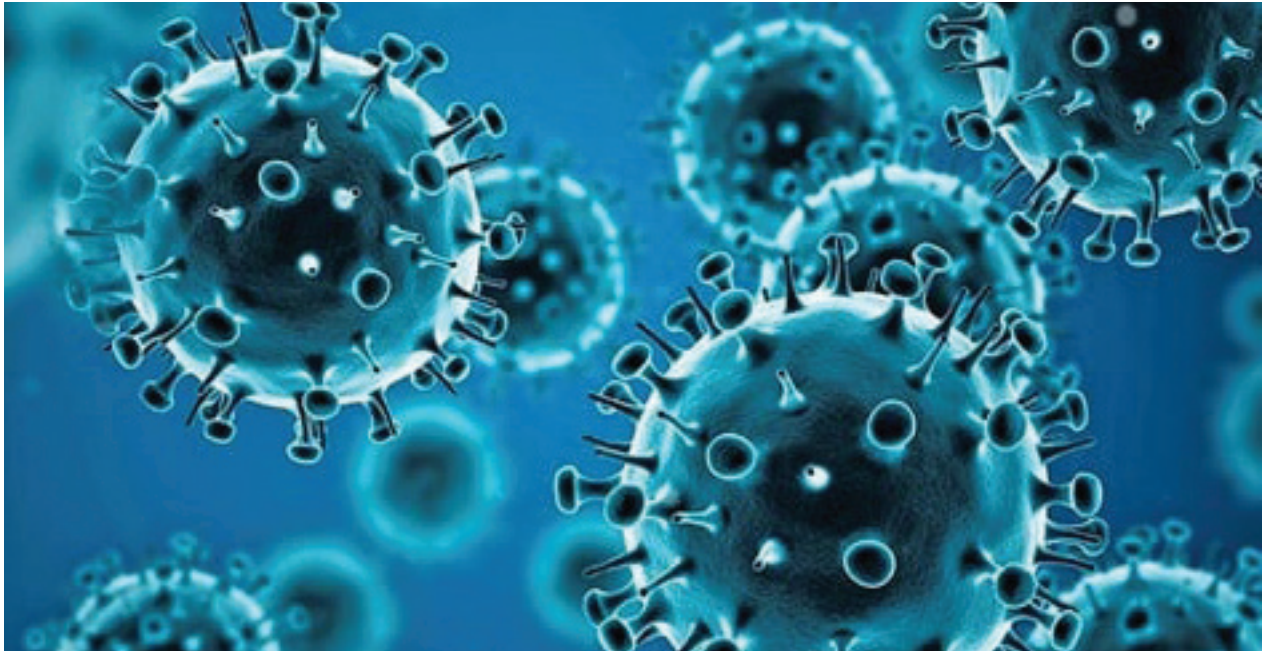

While I was still young I did not realize that I had a physical disability not until I joined High School Mengo Senior School where I realized I was way smaller than all of my peers. I remember my first day S.1 at Mengo I had not yet gotten my school Uniform, I was putting on a flowered dress and school shoes, most teachers and students thought I was a daughter of a teacher because of how I looked like.

I became the center of attention the moment I received my uniform because none of them believed that I was an S.1. Students were staring at me, teachers were calling me in every direction asking me all sorts of questions. I studied my Secondary levels both O and A level at Mengo S.S because I feared changing schools, I did not want to have the same attention and explaining myself to people about the disability that I have. Mengo helped me a lot because it had a zero-tolerance policy on bullying which would lead to expulsion and this made me feel safe. It helped me study well without facing any interruptions from students. “God creates us the way we are because of so many reasons but I believe because

to be at home as someone else works for us or we need to be just provided for which I totally hate.

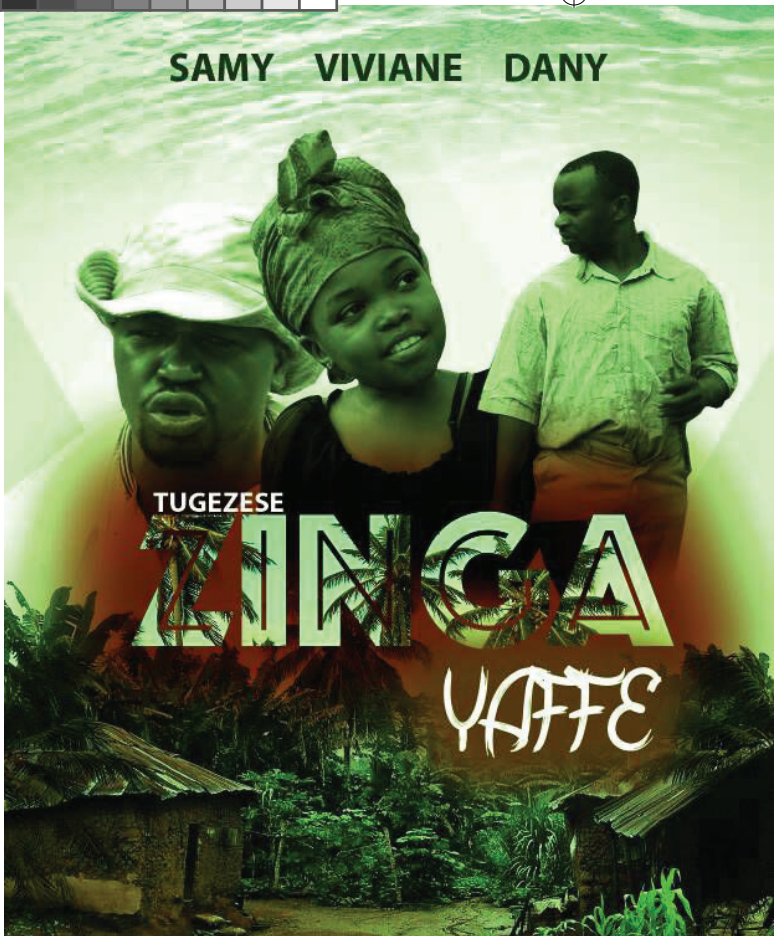

There is so much we as young people can do, University has 3 to 4 years depending on the program you're offering and University gives you the liberty to choose and this is always determined by a time factor.



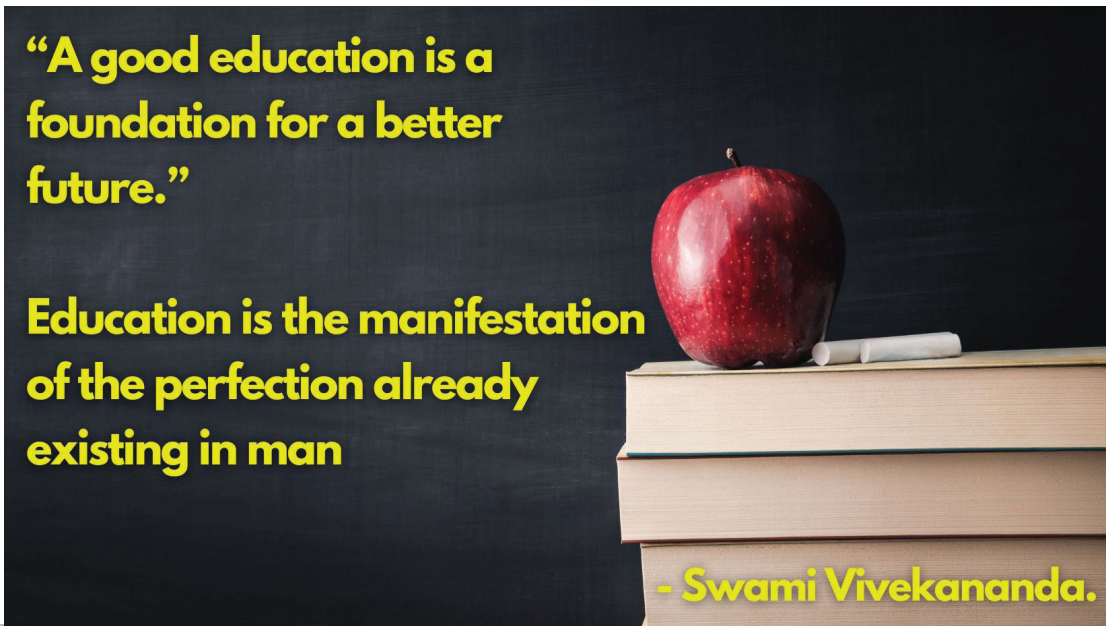

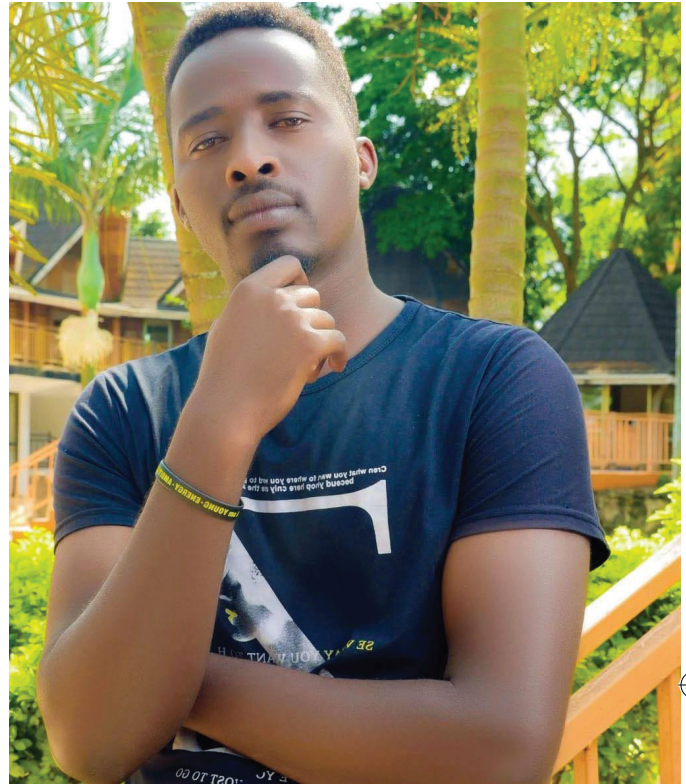
My Education Journey at MUBS

Throughout my school life, I loved politics in addition to serving, helping. Being active in the community, helped me not to waste time on issues like; the beautiful ladies at MUBS.

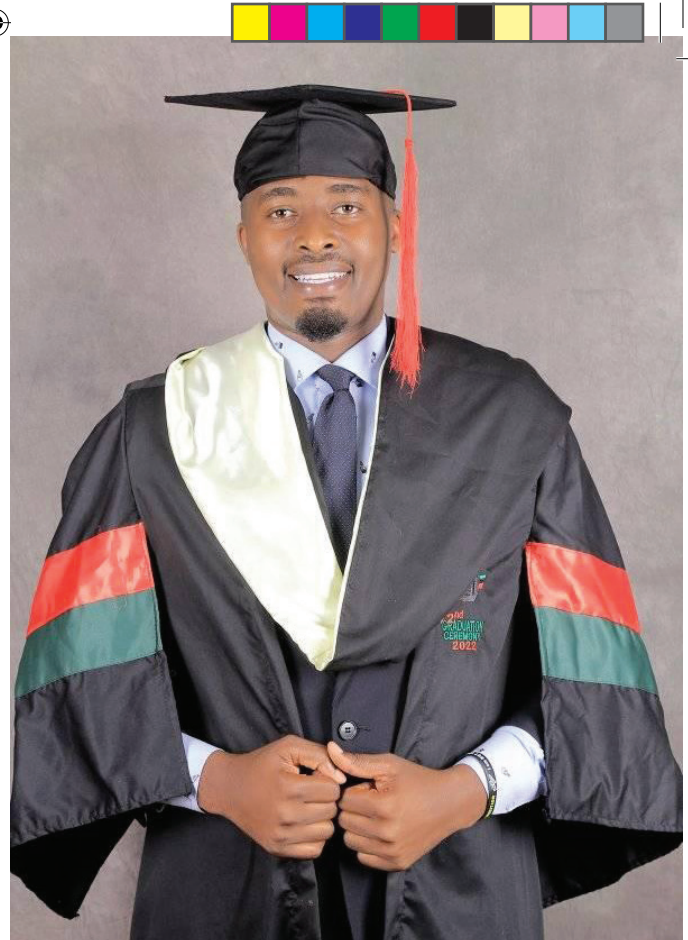

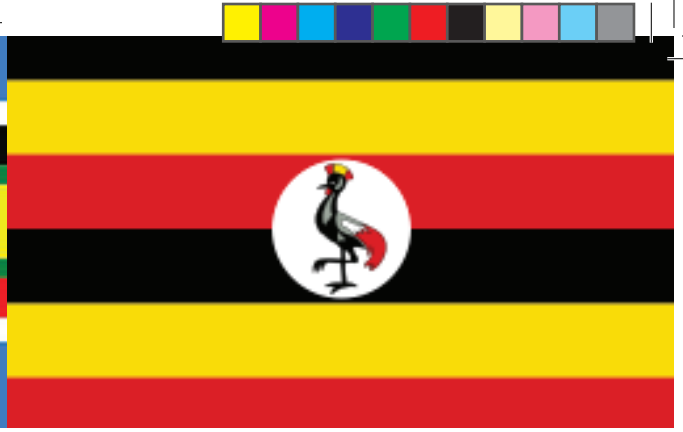
