Lt. Col. Rtd. Dr. Bright Rwamirama (Ph.D); Chairman MUBS Alumni Association

He is the State Minister for Animal Industry. He is an Alma mater of *Makerere University;* Certificate in Management, Bachelor of Business Administration, Master of Business Administration. *British Junior Staff College;* Junior Command and Staff Course, *Naval Postgraduate School;* Resource Management Course. He is an Accountant, Politician and a retired Army Officer.

Dr. Rwamirama is the Minister of State for Animal Industry. He also serves as the elected Member of Parliament representing "Isingiro County North", Isingiro District.

From 1978 until 1983, Dr. Rwamirama worked as a Banking Officer at Uganda Commercial Bank, the institution that later became Stanbic Bank Uganda. In 1983, he joined the National Resistance Army (NRA), in the Uganda Bush War to dislodge Milton Obote from power. He was appointed Officer in Charge of Pay in the NRA in 1986, serving in that capacity until 1989. In 1989, he was promoted to Director of Finance, in the NRA, which was renamed Uganda People's Defense Force (UPDF), in 1995. He served in that capacity at the UPDF headquarters, until 1997. He continued to serve as one of the Senior Staff Officers at UPDF Headquarters, until 2001. In 2001, he retired from the Armed Forces at the rank of lieutenant colonel. He joined politics, contesting for the parliamentary seat of "Isingiro County North", in Isingiro District. He won that seat and was re-elected to the same position in 2006 and 2011. He was appointed Minister of State for Animal Industry in June 2006.

Lt. Col. Rtd. Dr. Rwamirama is married. He belongs to the National Resistance Movement political party. His interests include conflict resolution, community development and watching sports events.

Before that, he was a serving officer in the Uganda Peoples Defense Forces (UPDF) and in the National Resistance Army (NRA) that preceded it. He is a member of the original 41 combatants with 27 guns who started the NRA in February 1981.

Who is Kevin
Atukunda?

Kevin Atukunda is a Ugandan from Bushenyi District, Ishaaka Municipality, Nyakabirizi Division, Remigorora Cell. I was born on February 9, 2001 to Mr. Erias Muramuzi and Ms. Allen Teshemerirwe.

Kindly let us know about your academic journey. Right from Primary to date.

I started School as early as 2004 from Kierere Primary School in Bushenyi and then later joined Parental Care Primary School, Bushenyi from 2010 to 2013 where I

myPLEwithafirstgradeof11Aggregate. In 2013, I was glad to join Mbarara High School also known as Chaapa for my Secondary level. I finished my O' level at Mbarara High School from 2013-2017 and I attained a first grade of 22 Aggregates. I was given another opportunity at Mbarara High School to proceed with A' level from 2018 to 2019. I offered Entrepreneurship (History, and Divinity)/ICT. UNEB results where officially released when I had 16 points that is A in History, A in Entrepreneurship and E in Divinity. I was not satisfied with these results and I decided to apply for remarking of my Divinity paper with the support of the school. I was remarked and finally Divinity results altered from E to A. UNEB processed a new payslip which indicated that I scored maximum 20 points at A' level. Before my remarking results were out, I had applied for Law preentry exams at Makerere University successfully passed which Ι with 52% and I was admitted on private to do Bachelors of Laws. Public University Joint Admission Board(PUJAB) which admits students on government had already issued and published a list of students on government. I decided to appeal to PUJAB for a National Merit consideration and I was admitted on government to do Bachelors in International Business (BIB) at MUBS. I had two options either to join

Makerere University and do Law on private or join MUBS and do BIB on Government sponsorship. I decided to join MUBS for Bachelors in International Business in 2020. I completed all my six semesters with a first class and with a final CGPA of 4.84 and managed to become the best student of MUBS of the 74th graduation.

How was it raising up as a child to where you are now?

I was raised by both my father and mother who shaped my childhood plus my teachers in primary and other relatives who would give relevant advice where need be. I grew up from a humble and God fearing family. During my younger age from Nursery up to P.7, I never liked going to school and I was forced by my father every morning to go to school and sometimes he would drop me to school early morning. After joining Mbarara High School, I found the environment good for my success and I liked the school up to date. How has life been since your last exam?

Lifetime after exiting the gates of the University is one of the most challenging part to most graduates. So after campus I stayed within Kampala without a job but I had to survive by all means. I tried to utilize the skills and knowledge I had acquired all long. I decided to start discussing and teaching some of the MUBS students who would give me commissions and some of the students connected me to their parents and parents paid me to continuously tutor their sons and daughters. Furthermore, I was also doing research and helping individuals who would approach and consult me on how to handle different research chapters. applied to different institutions for employment opportunities and succeeded with Airtel Uganda Limited where I was given an opportunity as a Graduate Management Trainee 2024.

What are those things that helped and guided you towards excellence?

- 1. Putting God first. As a christian I used to attend church service on Sunday from St. James Chapel MUBS.
- 2. Listening. I appreciate listening whether some one is communicating sense or not but I used to carefully listen to everyone and then make my own resolution.

- 3. Setting goals. I set goals in what ever I do and I always work hard to achieve the goals I have set. For example, my goal was to get a first class at campus.
- 4. Commitment. I am always committed to my tasks and what I am doing and I only missed two lectures while at campus when I was sick. But I fully attended all lectures and

- Confidence. This is key to me. Believing in my self that I can actually achieve and be outstanding. It was my confidence to remark UNEB results. I always believe that any result can be hypothetical and when your are not satisfied with the out come you can

- Doing research. Before I take actions, I had to first make research and get more information to help me make relevant and

- 11. Self drive. I adopted this when I was at Mbarara High School and I believe I can get the best out of myself. I always believed every answer is right provided you justify and provide strong defense to your answer.


Message to the current overall student

Entrepreneurship, Innovation and Incubation Centre

Entrepreneurship, Innovation Incubation Centre was established in 1998 as an outreach unit to link the school with the private, public and NGO sectors using different approaches.

At the establishment, it was known as the Small Business Development Centre

that supported businesses through training and business clinics. It grew over time and in 2005 it became the Entrepreneurship Centre supporting not just small business development but the growth of entrepreneurship. About four years ago, the African Development Bank supported the establishment of incubation Centres at public universities in Uganda **MUBS** Entrepreneurship and Centre was transformed into the Entrepreneurship, Innovation and Incubation Center. The Centre has partnered with numerous organizations and one of them is Stanbic Bank under the Stanbic Bank Business Incubator to provide training to different entrepreneurs. Other organizations that the Centre has partnered with include; NSSF, DFCU Bank, Orient Bank, Private Sector Foundation, MasterCard Foundation, Innovation Hub, MTN among others.

E-Learning Centre

How has life as a hustling student been and what motivated you into leadership?




Could it be Formal or Self Employment?



Where was he born?

When Wasswa joined the University, he was like any other student, although some people found him unique due to his height and childlike looks. What has Wasswa Mubarak achieved from looking little?



Where does he get his resilience?

Wasswa attributes his resilience and positivity to his parents, who encouraged him and made him believe he could be great instead of asking himself questions crying. The biggest weapon he has is his education, and he thanks his parents for not giving up on him. He also has his selfesteem and positivity, accepting who he is and living his story, not what others call him. He expressed gratitude to his friend Ssenyonga Badru, his boss Kawoya Aloysius, and the MUBS Administration, particularly Dr. Mukyala Veronica, who was like a mother to him at some point. He mentioned that she used to call him to her office

since he was the president, and they would share ideas. He also thanked Prof. Waswa Balunywa, who had mentored him in leadership and entrepreneurship. He added that he is grateful for his dad, whom he loves very much.

Advice from Wasswa to other disadvantaged people Wasswa advises everyone to believe in themselves, seek advice, and fight the negativity and stigma of being different. He believes that disability is not inability and that little people like himself can do big things that other people have done. He prays for a bright future and thanks his parents leaving for never him. Wasswa's story is one of perseverance determination. and Despite facing challenges and discrimination, he rose above them and became a leader in community. his His story serves as an inspiration to others to believe themselves and never give their up on dreams.


