Editorial

Are Universities Responsible for Increased Unemployment?



n today's workforce, 'soft skills' have become increasingly valued by employers. Unlike the past,employees hired basing on their hard skills, organizations are now putting much emphasis on soft skills ability to communicate, collaboration and team, flexibility, positive attitude, empathy, work ethics among others. These qualities are not taught in school, but they are increasingly important in order to be competitive at work.

While education, degrees, and certification are important for scoring a job interview, organizations place higher value on soft skills. These intangible qualities affect everything from productivity to the relationship with colleagues at work.

In his address to the MUBS 13th graduating class, the CEO Stanbic Bank Mr. Patrick Mweheire explained that hard skills are what you do, and soft skills are how you do it". Unfortunately, employers believe that the employees' soft skills have gotten worse in the past

Prof Balunywa Re-appointed MUBS Principal

President Yoweri Museveni reappointed Prof. Waswa Balunywa as Principal Makerere University Business School, after his contract expired on May 27, 2018. Prof Balunywa was re appointed MUBS Principal for the next five years.

In a letter instructing the Minister of Education and Sports to effect the re-appointment, the President said, "one of the obstacles that have wasted our time, is a disoriented, pro-imperialism academia" because Prof. Balunywa has always been on the liberation side of ideology in addition to being an active administrator.

"I am writing to direct you to re-appoint Prof. Waswa Balunywa as the Principal Makerere University Busi-

ness School (MUBS) for another term upon the expiry of this one," the letter read.

The letter further stated that, "his institution has been free of strikes. I have never found him averse to

advice the times I have interacted with him. Such a person is always good to work with." Prof. Balunywa's re-appointment ended the battle ground between him and Prof. Vanasius Baryamureeba, the MUBS Council Chairman, with whom there has been a sharp fall out over who is the boss.

The Special Council had sat on Monday May 28 2018and appointed the Deputy Principal Assoc. Prof. Moses Muhwezi Balunywa replace Balunywa. On May 29, 2018 the President wrote to the asking her to re-appoint Balunywa as Principal MUBS.

Makerere University Chancellor, Prof Ezra Suruma, has encouraged MUBS graduands to be creative and innovative to be able to solve Uganda's problems.

"I encourage you to try new things and new ways of solving Uganda's problems. It is not true that America, Europe, China, World Bank or IMF are going to solve our problems. Yes they can help here and there but if we do not wake up and plan our communities,by setting targets for production and productivity, for coffee, cotton and maize,

Uganda will be left behind and even risks to lose its independence," noted Prof. Suruma.

Dr Suruma added that having graduated through an education system that largely examines the ability to cram and memorize facts and figures; the graduands had to reinvent themselves. The skill of cramming and reducing information is a skill that no longer has much value.

He made the remarks while addressing MUBS and ICT- University graduands who received their awards in the various academic qualifications at the MUBS 13th Graduation held on May 24, 2018 at the MUBS main, Nakawa.

Prof. Suruma advised the graduands to be ready to adopt to the new technology to be able to reduce poverty by creating more jobs and also solve community problems like disease, unwanted pregnancies, drugs among others.

skills," Nawangwe said


"I can not believe you are leaving this school which you ably nurtured from scratch to the giant it is today. I do not want to believe that you are

MUBS Awards Sebandeke For Spearheading Sickle Cells campaign

In Ssebandeke Ashiraf was awarded by MUBS for advocating for the rights of fellow students living with sickle cell disease who are usually discriminated by society. He has been an advocate for sickle cell disease for over 10 years. His advocacy work started at the age of 14. While in high school he began

speaking about sickle cell, which was almost a taboo in Uganda. At the time information about sickle cell in Uganda was non-existent. Ssebandeke has continued to fight negative stigmas surrounding sickle cell which has become a lifestyle for him.

He noted that since soft skills are not learnt from school, require constant learning. Such skills include the ability to deal with people and motivate others. He also says that someone with the right kind of soft skills has to have the ability to solve problems under pressure.

The soft skills he says will come in handy for looking for employment, as that's how people with the same education on paper are differentiated. For those who want to start businesses, he said convincing someone to believe in an idea that does not exist yet, is not something that can be learnt in school. The fact that millennials stay longer with company if, the business' goals are aligned with personal ones means that even holding onto employees can be for an executive that lacks soft skills.

"The challenge that you face individually and collectively is that remembering Napoleon's birthday is no longer of much value because you can get this information off the internet in an instant," he noted.

President Museveni noted that Prof

Balunywa, "has been on the liberation side ideology in addition to being an active administrator. His institution has been free of strikes; I have never found him averse of advice the times i have interacted with him. Such a person is always good to work with, " wrote the President. Prof Balunywa welcomed his re-appointment, saying it gives him the opportunity to complete his expansion plan.

He and his team, he said, have challenged themselves to transfer business education to all corners of the country by making it accessible and cheaper to Ugandans.

Expansion plans

"We have a five-year plan to open more branches in Gulu, Entebbe and maybe Fort Portal so as to increase access to business education. By opening these campuses, we want to lower the cost of accessing business education and create more entrepreneurs in the region," he said.

Asked how he will relate with Prof Baryamureeba with whom he appeared to have fallen out, Prof Balunywa said he was not interested in personal fights but was rather focused on a fight to achieve a common objective rather than discussing personalities.

"I hope he finds the statements he made about me regrettable. We shall find a way of resolving it. We are born with character but we find ways of resolving differences to achieve common objectives not personal objectives," he said.



47 Luzira inmates Graduate at MUBS 13th Convocation

Makerere University Business School awarded 47 inmates from Luzira Upper Prison with Diplomas and Certificates in Entrepreneurship and Small Business Management in absentia.

These inmates were part of the 1,419 graduates who were passed out at the MUBS 13th graduation ceremony held on Friday May 25, 2018. The 13th Graduation ceremony was presided over by Makerere University Chancellor, Prof. Ezera Suruma under the theme "Developing Soft Skills for Business Development". This was the 8th time Makerere University Business School

is presenting inmates for the awards. MUBS started the Luzira University Education programme in 2011 as a Social Corporate Responsibility which has encouraged inmates in primary and secondary levels to upgrade to University level.

Majority of the Luzira inmates who have graduated on this programme have transformed from being society rejects to becoming useful citizens in the country.

After successfully running certificate and diploma programmes at Luzira Upper Prison Inmates Study Centre, the School has plans to start a degree programme. Management believes that introducing a degree programme in Luzira prisons is inevitable due to the high demand for skills development among the inmates which grows by the day.

Educating prisons dates as far back as the 1700s in Europe as a religious type, where prisoners were provided with Bibles while in solitary confinement. Prison bible reading was introduced on a notion that prisoners had committed crimes and wronged other people, and being alone in confinement with the bible would allow them the opportunity for reflection and introspection.

Ex Inmate Into Charity Work

Mr. Jonathan Mugerwa an ex convict who was arrested in 2005, Charged and Condemned to death but miraculously released in 2016 narrates howtheMUBSprogrammehepursued while in Prison changed his life. Mugerwa enrolled on the MUBS certificate programme and later upgraded to Diploma in Entrepreneurship and **Business** Administration where he graduated with first class on both programmes. On returning home, he was accepted back in the society and he enrolled for

Bachelors Degree in Entrepreneurship and Business Administration through Diploma entry scheme. He is currently in his second year of study at makerere University Business School.

Mugerwa together with other Exconvicts have formed a charity organization "Buena Charity Services Uganda", (BCSU) to provide assistance and support to ex-offenders with the aim to reduce recidivism and also reduce the rates of entry into the correction centers and prisons. He explained that when offenders are

released from prison, thev suffer; financial difficulties, little or no support from families friends. unemployment, homelessness. little life and self management skills. Transitioning from controlled prison environment, which has

structured and strict routine and rules, to the community, is very challenging and difficult for ex offenders. We help them to reintegrate into society which treats them as gone cases.

"More than 7000 incarcerated people will eventually be freed in Uganda this year. We shall join efforts with the government, churches and stakeholders to manage the needs and challenges of the over whelming re-entry in Uganda", he noted. It's of no yield to the public, family, and taxpayers for a person to come out of prison and go back in (recidivism). Me and you have the solution and we shall not hold back, or sit back when the devil is snatching our brothers and sisters to the place of social death, spiritual death, economic death and finally, physical death. We shall intensify Correctional and severance lecturer tours in schools, universities other institutions across the country. join us to mitigate
